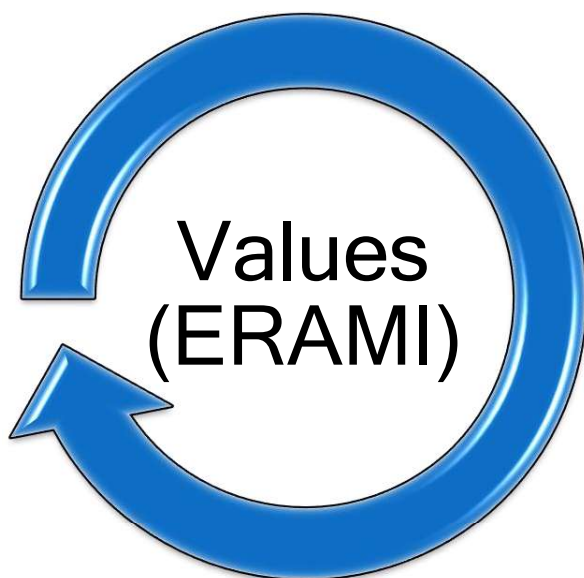

To achieve the objectives, three programs are being implemented: (1) educational tours and constructive engagements; (2) Promote sport in all communities to keep the boys healthy, busy and protect them against substance abuse and (3) Promote education by assisting the boys on their study revisions particularly in mathematics and physical science/Technology.

This is after the team collected 3 out of 4 cups from the four (4) BCLFA junior's divisions. Our under 11, 15 & 17 were crowned the champions in their respective divisions. The under 11 took the most points from the 3 teams that had to face each other on a points system. Our under 15 faced Brakpan Bush bucks in the final and won on penalties after their 2-2 draw. Under 17 took the most points from the 3 teams that had to face each other on a points system.

Thrilling end for Top 8 tourney

The Brakpan Central Local Football Association (BCLFA) Top 8 Football Tournament concluded on Saturday at the Brakpan Sports Grounds with two matches and a prize-giving ceremony.

The two games were for the U13 and U15 age groups, but the U11 and U17 teams also received awards for their wins recently. While the tournament aims for eight teams per category, the U11 and U17 categories only had six teams, so winners were decided based on points earned.

The U13 game was between Sallies Club Football and Leachville Shooters FC, who both ended with one point, and a penalty shootout ensued, after which Sallies won 4-2.

The U15 game was between Ntsiks Football Stars and Brakpan Bush Bucks FC, which ended 2-2 before the shootout, from which Ntsiks emerged as victors with a final score of 5-3. Ntsiks also took the trophy in the U11 and U17 categories in the tournament, making their coach, Ntsikelelo Makaka, extremely proud.

Ntsikelelo is also the chairperson of the competitions committee for the Brakpan Sports Association.

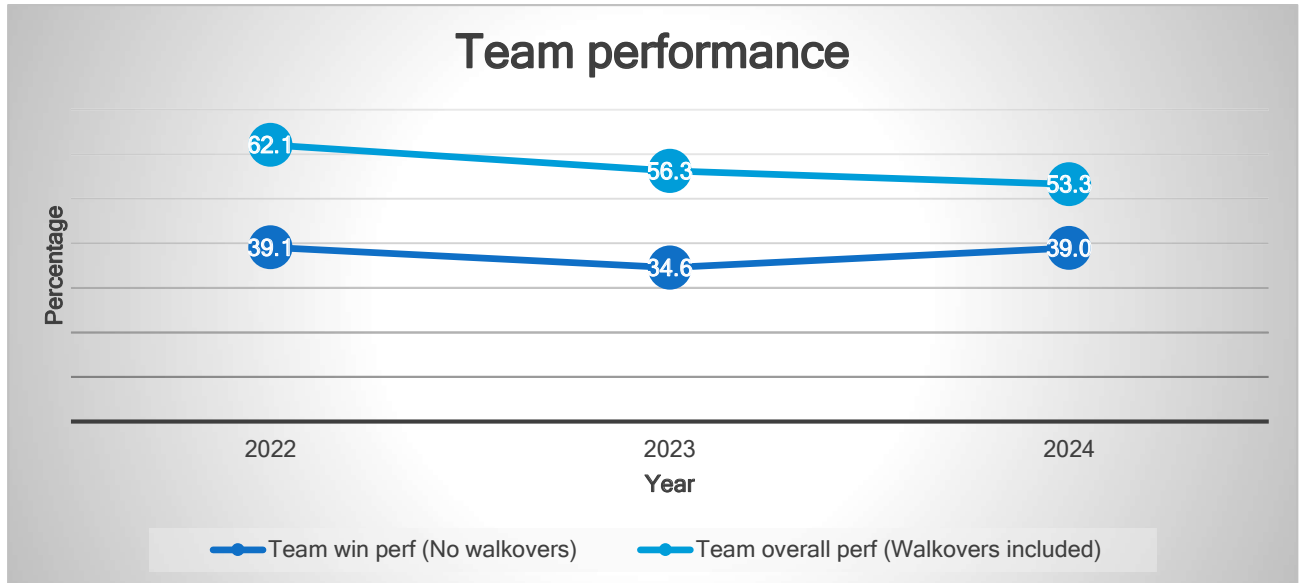
Brakpan League

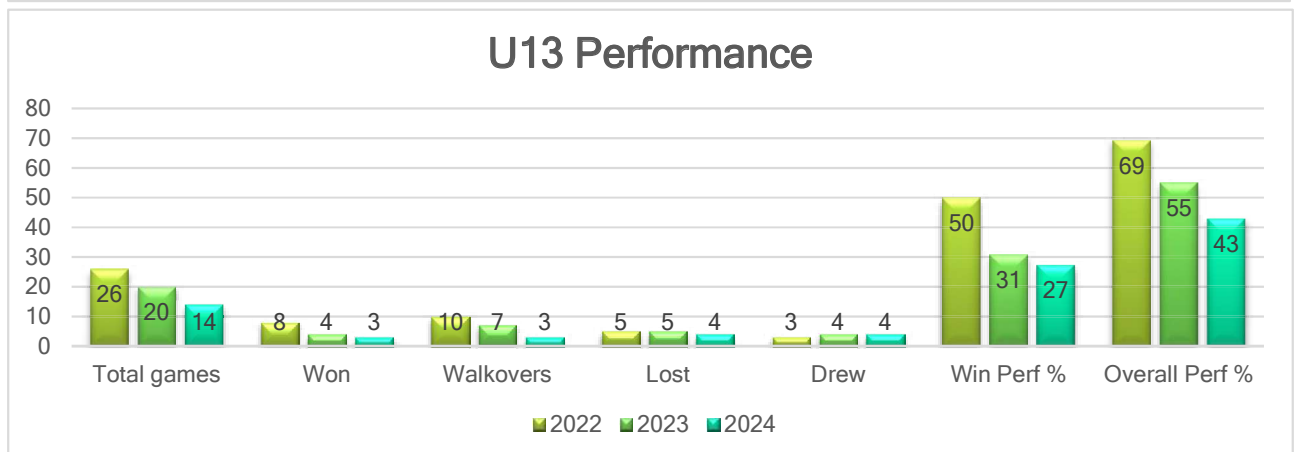

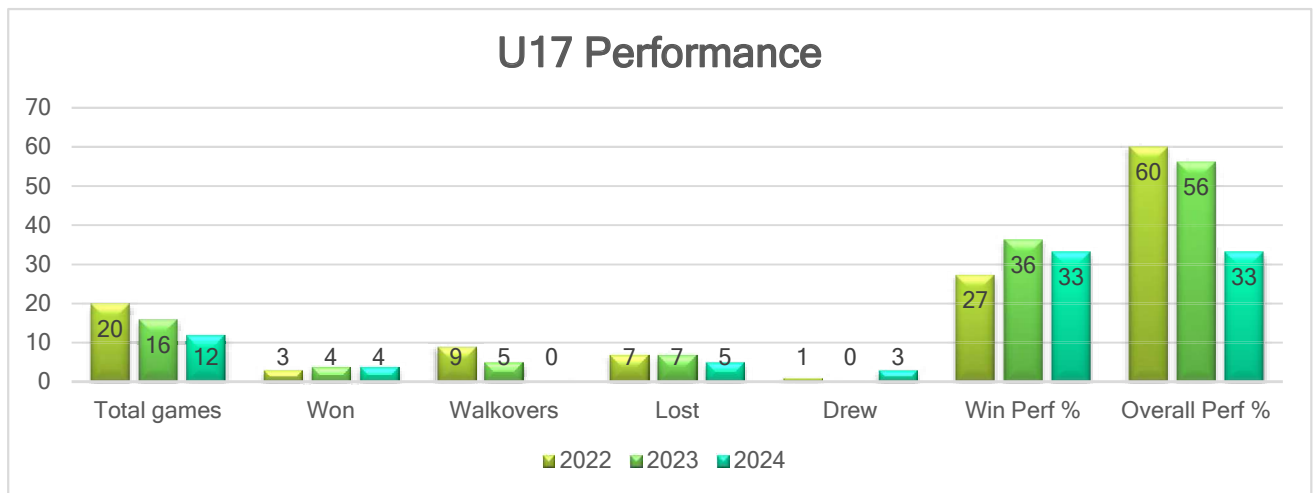
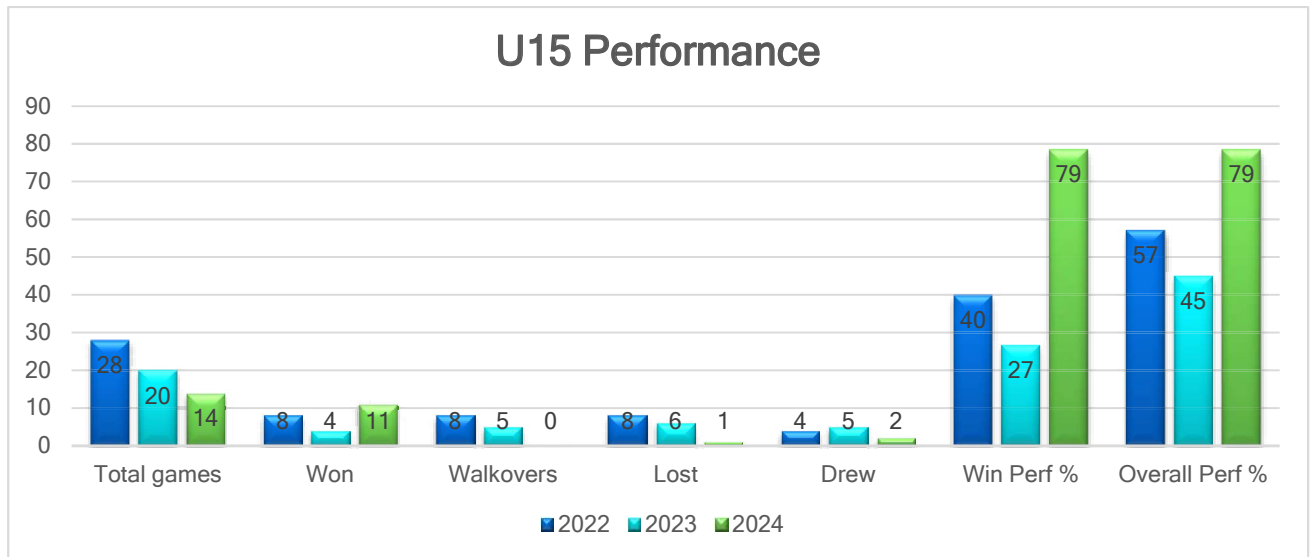
The graph below shows comparison between the three years since we joined Brakpan central local football association's league. Great improvement indeed.

In as much as the team performance have improved, some of the division's performance has dropped compared to the previous year and only the under 15 performance increased drastically affecting the overall team performance positively. Though the under 13 performance dropped but they still managed to improve in terms of the league position. This year they moved to position 3 as compared to position 4 in the previous years.





Our under 15 maintained position 1 from the first game of the league up until the last game. They won 11 games out of 14 games, drew 2 and only lost 1 game. They won the league championship title in this division, winning a trophy and gold medals. Under 13 also managed to secure position 3 in the league winning themselves bronze medals. Our under 13 and 15 received their prizes on the 16th of November 2024 at the award ceremony hosted by Brakpan Central Local Football Association. The under 13 was receiving their second bronze medal this year. Despite losing their games in the first leg, they improved their performance towards the end of the second leg and finished third. They've improved their position when compared to the past two years since they joined the league. In the past two years they've been maintaining position number 4.

The under 15 maintained position 1 from game 1 of this season in their division. From game 1 it was clear that the boys were determined to win the title this year. And indeed, they won it with 6 points ahead of their runners up. Great performance compared to the previous years. Their win performance, being referred to the games they played (excluding walkovers), has been below 50% in the past two years and or since joined the league, thus

40% in 2022 and 27% in 2023. Their determination saw them drastically improving their percent to 79% this year and being the champions. They won 11 games, only lost 1 game, and drew 2 games out of the 14 games they played. This determination not only won them the league title but also won them the BCLFA top 8 title.

The tournament consisted of 12 teams from around Brakpan. From the 12 teams Ntsiks Football stars was able to reach the top 3 which was a massive achievement to the team.



It was a huge event that was supported by many community members. Giving the boys an opportunity to play at such events allows them to showcase their talent, and this is in line with the vision and mission of Ntsiks Foundation. Boys get opportunities to be identified in such events. The Build it U13 Festival is one big festival that develop future stars. It is at this event that some of the big professional teams identify potential talent and draft young ones into their development programs. Ntsiks Football Stars is looking forward to participate in this event if so invited in the coming year/s.



Ntsiks Foundation's community/fans also came in numbers to support our boys in this event. We believe their presence and support contributed immensely in encouraging the boys to fight and reach to the top 3. The boys won themselves a soccer ball and reflective bibs and became bronze medalist.



OR Tambo Soncini games

The OR Tambo-Soncini Social Cohesion Games are held to commemorate the life and legacy of OR Tambo, and in remembrance of the friendship with his exile host in Italy, Giuseppe Soncini (City of Ekurhuleni, 2023). Brakpan Local Football Association participates in this event. A 22 player's squad was this year selected from all teams affiliated with the BLFA. This year, 2 players (**Ophola Mthembu** and **Akhanya Ngqentsu**) from Ntsiks Football Stars were amongst the squad that the BLFA had to send to these inter LAF's selection games. Selection started at inter LFA's selections at Duduza Stadium in Tsakane for Ekurhuleni East group. Our boy **Akhanya Ngqentsu** was amongst the final squad that was selected in the Ekurhuleni East and had gone to the final regional selection that took place at Delville Stadium in Germiston. His journey for these games ended at the regional selection where he was not selected for the final regional squad. As a foundation we are so proud of him and believe that this was not a failure but is just a delayed success.

On the 17th of September 2024 we had a surprise visit by Mr. Johannes Nhlapho. Mr. Nhlapho is a professional cyclist who falls within the elite RSA cyclists. Amongst the Clubs he cycled for is Victoria Club, Aurasan, Microsoft etc. He was amongst the 13 finishers on a 600km cycling in May 1999. During his engagement with the boys he emphasized love and discipline as being one of the things that had made him successful in his career. Being a disciplined person can open up many doors. Discipline comes in many ways such as being on training at the scheduled time, respecting and loving your teammates etc. (Mr. Johannes Nhlapho, 2024).

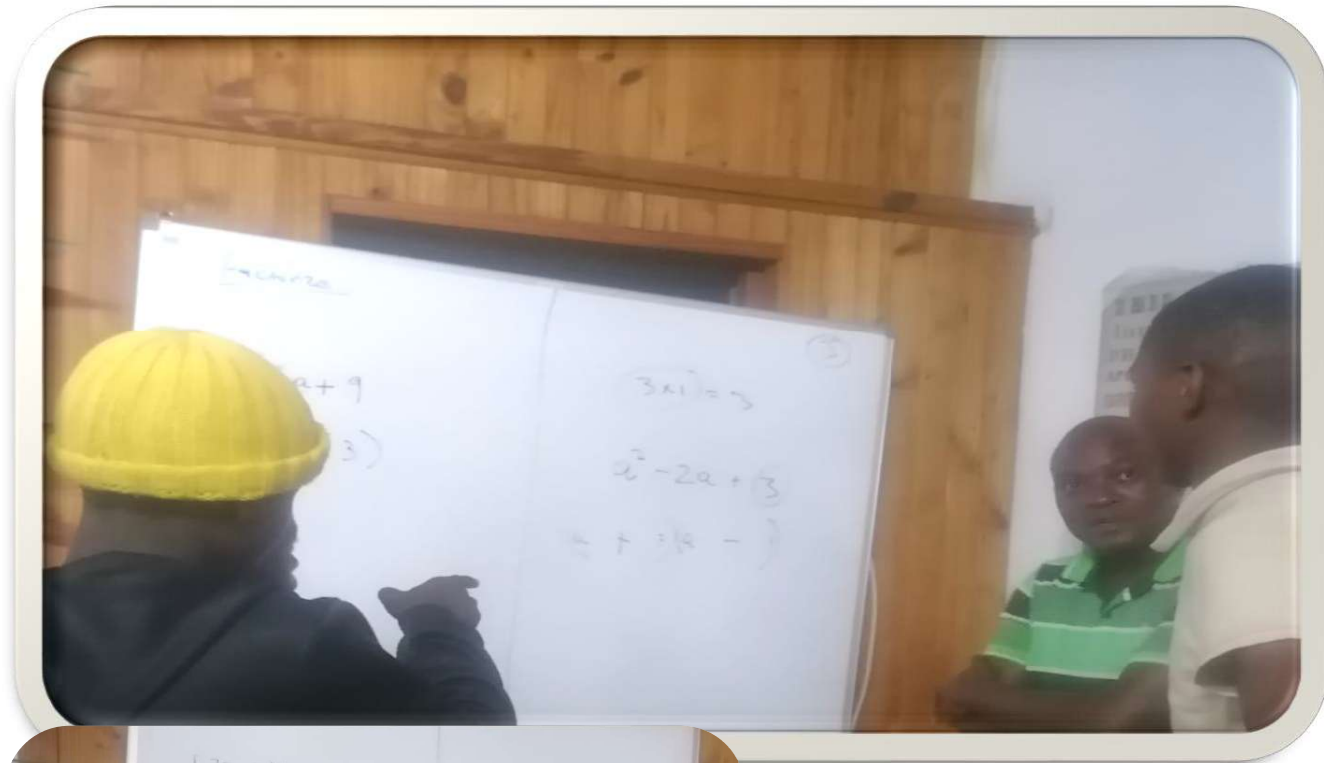
Mr. Nhlapho told the boys that on his first cycling, he cycled a radius of about 80km the whole day whereas the cyclist he was cycling with did it in half a day. But according to him that actually motivated him to do more for him to do it in half a day or even less. Eventually he managed to do it in less time after he had put a lot of effort. The lesson he had learned was that never give up on your dreams just put more effort and you will succeed.

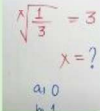

Mr. Lungisile Makaka joined the speakers and in his speech he encouraged the boys to keep pressing for their success



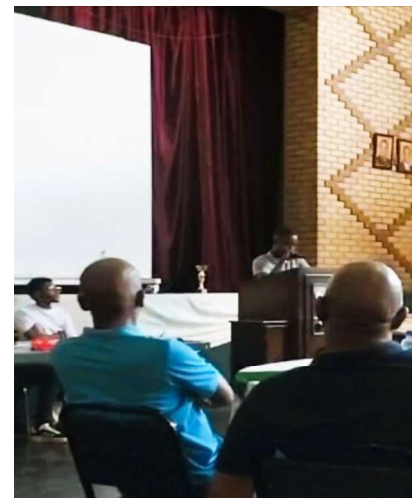

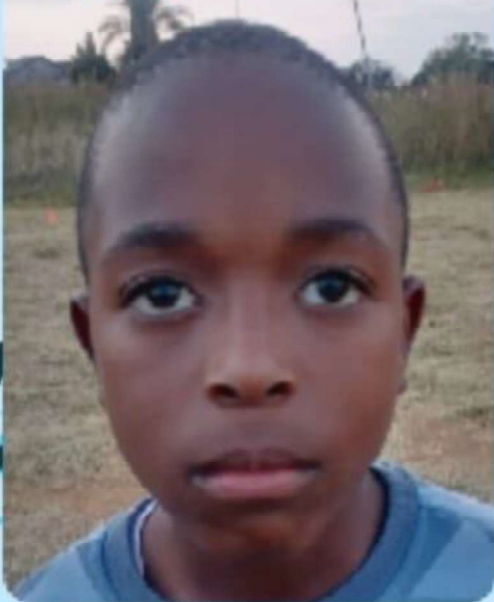

This is also demonstrated by the fact that certain boys from the Ntsiks Football Stars are chosen by the Association and region to participate on other levels higher than Ntsiks Football Stars.

Most constructive engagements dwell on discipline. There were few ill-discipline cases reported by parents and or discovered by the organization. Ntsiks Football Stars continue to be regarded as the most adhering to rules team in the BCLFA. We are seeing parents bringing their boys to the organization citing discipline as number 1 reason. This proves the effectiveness of our constructive engagements that we as an organization pursue each year.

In term 4, the majority of boys had an exceptional pass rate. Positive outcomes are coming from ongoing support for education and cooperation with other groups and individuals in this program. Unlike last year, there hasn't been an instance where a parent has pulled a boy out for not paying attention to the books.

The achievements and challenges we face are thoroughly described on how to attain, preserve, and/or handle them when they arise, rather than being left unexplained. These are done with the purpose of molding the boys into grown, disciplined men.

According to the aforementioned, the organization is gradually heading in the right direction, albeit there are still certain areas that require work. These will involve gaining the boys scholarships, enrolling them in professional football programs, and interacting with higher authorities more frequently, among other things.
